What is an Ambassador?

On this sunny and unseasonably warm winter day, I have taken the opportunity to reflect on what is an ambassador. I had just come from a meeting of the Ambassador's Fellowship held in our chapel. This is a group of former ministers and missionaries who meet once a quarter. They share their stories of what God has done in and through them for His glory. I consider it a blessing to work at Fairhaven and to be around the many saints (ambassadors) who have spread the good news of Jesus Christ in countries all over the world. Some of these saints have shepherded flocks of Christ's church across the country and preached His Word to those who needed to hear the good news of the gospel and to grow in their walk with their Lord and Savior.

What is an ambassador? In 2 Corinthians 5:20a Paul says, "We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us." An ambassador is a REPRESENTATIVE – one who represents another. He represents Christ. Paul challenges us to be Christ like and present ourselves in ways that display virtues of God every day.

Duplex resident Dorothy Chick shared her story at the most recent Ambassador's Fellowship. Dorothy spent 38 years overall in foreign missions, with 30 of those years to the Zulu people in the Republic of South Africa. She said, "It is good to hear peoples' stories and we don't always have time socially." As followers of Jesus Christ, we can be ambassadors for Him right here in our city of Rockford, or even in this place, Fairhaven.



Regarding Fairhaven projects, we are excited to be able to use our new permanent pavilion in our courtyard as the weather gets nicer. We appreciate those who gave to our 2021 Give-a-gift fundraising and those who contributed memorial funds. Please "save the date" of June 12 for a time of dedication and celebration. We will have a plaque near the pavilion commemorating the names of those that funds were given in memory of.

Regarding our 2023 Give-a-gift campaign in which over \$124,000 has been raised, work is underway for the two projects mentioned in the letter last Fall. As of this writing, three apartments have been renovated, one is close to being finished, and two more are just starting. Regarding the Health Center therapeutic tub, plans are underway, a quote has been given, and a visit to see one at a nearby facility has been scheduled.

May God bless you in this year ahead and may we continue to seek His wisdom and keep our eyes on Him.



Pavilion Construction

Fairhaven broke ground in November for the addition of a pavilion in the chapel courtyard. It was completed just before Christmas. Previously, Fairhaven had added a tent canopy for hosting outdoor chapels, activities, visits, and events. We found that the canopy continued to prove very useful for shading residents, families, and guests and saw the use of the courtyard area increase. Outside of a sheltered space for residents and families to visit. In addition to this being a sheltered space for residents and families to visit, the chapel patio is used regularly for scheduled summer picnics, summer music & s'more nights, and special events.. The pavilion offers a permanent covering of the chapel patio with the benefit of electricity, long-term use, and stability.

Marilyn and Armour Johnson

Warm summer days in the Midwest are a wonderful contrast to the frosty winter months. The beauty of the summer sun can be a metaphor for His presence in our lives: "For the Lord God is a sun and shield ... No good thing will He withhold from those who walk uprightly" (Psalm 84:11). For many, summers are packed with memory-making experiences: vacations, cross country road trips, backyard barbecues, parades, sandy beaches, concerts, community events, fireworks, and nature-bound summer camps.

During the summer of 1951, in quaint Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, Covenant Harbor hosted Marilyn (19) and Armour (21) who developed a friendship that sparked into a loving marriage several years later in Princeton, IL.

Owned by the Evangelical Covenant Church,
Covenant Harbor has served over 75 years as a place
of refuge and fun for all ages including some of
Johnson's grandchildren and their son. Over time,
Covenant Harbor's mission has been to "draw people
from their routines into opportunities to enjoy creation,
recreation and relationships, so that all will experience
God through Jesus Christ." They have helped shape
generations by highlighting such principals as
"relationships matter" and "purposeful experience."



Covenant Harbor was so important to the two of them that at Marilyn's passing in 2014, memorials were designated to Covenant Harbor so future generations could continue to enjoy camp. Marilyn and Armour's life together eventually led them to Fairhaven where they lived in a duplex surrounded by friends, participated in community activities, and enjoyed a caring Christian environment. Upon Marilyn's passing, Armour moved into the Haven and continued to be actively involved.

The importance of Fairhaven was evident to their daughter Lynn and her husband Darrell: "Fairhaven was a special place for my mom and dad. They were surrounded by great friends and great caregivers. My brother Jay and I are thankful for the care and love received." In 2023, Lynn and Darrell generously provided a gift to Fairhaven in honor of Marilyn and Armour who no doubt smile upon their friends and family from their heavenly resting place where the warm summer sun shines bright.
